



Golf Course Landscape

Generally, if you ask a superintendent what he dreads the most about maintaining a golf course is the need for landscape beds, flowers or the addition of trees. The club wants to beautify the facility but we worry about the extra hand watering and whether the plants will survive. Well, include a sound soil drench with Turf-Pro after planting and increase the survival rate by 75% and shorten the higher water requirements for establishment.

For smaller beds or a few small trees, mix 1 gallon of Turf-Pro in a 15 – 30 gallon sprayer and fill with water. After planting and initial soaking of the bed or tree, remove spray wand from hose handle and freely apply a drench of the mixed solution of Turf-Pro to the soil. For larger areas, mix 5 gallons in a 150 – 200 gallon spray rig, remove the nozzle or handgun on the hose and freely drench bed or tree rings.

The above mentioned process can be used for bare areas on greens, collars, tees, fairways or for small sod projects and any areas needing fast immediate recovery.
